We held the Whole School Assembly yesterday, and it is a great sight to see nearly 2000 students and staff gathered together on the field. New staff were introduced and student leaders were acknowledged. The Head Students each addressed the assembly, reflecting on their own experiences, motivations and aspirations. A common theme was the acceptance and celebration of diversity.

- Please ask for a visitor's sticker, if it is not given automatically, which you must wear at all times whilst you are on school grounds.
- Remember to sign out when you leave.

The student must go to their Tutor Teacher to sign in late


If the student is late to school after tutor time


- The student must sign in at the Student Office and

Signmee Communication Tool

Signmee is a new communication tool that the Sports Department is currently trialling with the hope of using it permanently. Basically, it allows our Sports Staff to generate an online permission slip catered to each sport or activity which is then emailed home and can be signed online in your own Signmee account.

- · When your child is selected for a team you will be sent your first permission slip to your email address and be asked to create a log in with a password for Signmee.
- You will then be able to view your Signmee inbox and any permission slips may be opened and filled in from here.
- It is important to note that all fields must be filled in, even with an NA if required, before you can complete the form.
- To sign permission the parent must re-enter their Signmee password into the box at the bottom and this notifies the sports department that your child is good to go.
