What's this about?

Your child is entitled to an annual dental package every year up until they turn 18 years. We have partnered with Counties Manukau District Health Board to provide onsite dental care and improve the adolescent uptake of these packages. The programme aims at preventing and/or reducing tooth decay.

What's my child entitled to?

Once enrolled with a dentist, your child is entitled to an annual dental check-up package determined by the Ministry of Health, this includes the following:

- One Dental consultation
- · X-rays and diagnosis where required
- Other preventive treatments where required
- Oral health education and advice to maintain healthy teeth and gums

How does it work?

Once consent has been given, Smilecare Mobiles work closely with the school to ensure they operate while minimizing any learning disruptions.
