
Courses and Careers Day is the University of Auckland's annual open day and your opportunity to experience what it's like to be a student at New Zealand's leading university.

Aloha.... That's what we hear all over Hawaii, the formal greeting for all manuhiri to this 50th state of USA. All smiles and hugs on pickup then straight to the Hale where we settled in before a whakawhanaungatanga with hosts. Our hosts were wonderful, providing anything we wanted at a drop of a hat. Food till it came out of our ears and the whanau loving as ever.

We visited Ka'ala Farms to see the care and respect given to protect their Ala - whenua and all that is growing, very humbling and we have such a lot of respect for the kaitiaki of these lands. Our students did their part and helped clear the taro gardens of toxic plants to enable the growth of taro to flourish, awesome mahi. Many thanks to Uncle Pokii and Koro Butch for their sharing.

Maunga Kapu - we eventually made our way to the top of this maunga and were given a brief understanding on the name of this mountain, and what has or is being done to sustain growth of all native plants, areas for hunting and the scenery was breath taking. Much aroha to Nelson Rodriguez #tanemahuta, who is one of the workers on this maunga and a Makua from the centre, for leading our roopu on this excursion.

Interactions with the students - Wet and Wild Water park always a good day to share with the students and then to a night event Paradise Cove, experiencing Hawaiian games and pastimes- cultural participation in lei making, tribal tattoo (temporary that is), spear throwing, waka ama. Luau (umu) sharing of food and the night show displayed all the cultures of the pacific - Maori, Hawaiian, Samoa, Tahitian. Such a lovely night for all.

Whakawhangaungatanga and poroporoaki, it is always a sad time leaving our hosts who were the perfect hosts. Whaikorero sharing a moment of what they had learnt while at Queen Liliuokalani - what an experience, there was the exchange of gifts, and many hugs and kihi. Then we were off to the other side of Hawaii to the hustle and bustle of Waikiki, our students certainly saw the difference in Native Hawaiian culture and Hawaiian-American culture very different indeed. Our final meet up with the whanau O Liliuokalani was a shared breakfast with all of them before leaving for the airport. More tears and gifts aue.... 'mahana te ngakau' mo nga Ohana of Hawaii , kei te tangi mo koutou.

Thank you to all our whanau who were there to tautoko their tamaiti in the fundraising which enabled our journey to go forward, love you all. To the V8s, International Department, Rosehill Special School, and all the students and staff from Rosehill College who bought from our stalls. They all said they will never forget this experience and understand why we do the things we do.
