

Tournament of Minds

This year seven Year 9 & 10 students from Rosehill took part in the Tournament of Minds competition. T.O.M is a problem solving programme which is held across NZ & Australia. The team comprised of William Lintott, Noah Parker, Phillip Liu, Cameron Airey, Lily Hart, Nathan Kruse and Hannah Brown.

It is based for Primary and Secondary schools. The students gain and use the following skills throughout the competition: Problem Solving, Confidence, Time Management, Team Work and Creativity

The programme consists of a long term and short term challenge, which both involve dramatically performing in a 3x3m square, for set amounts of time. The long term challenge included 6 weeks of research and planning. There were four different categories for the long term challenge this year: Literature, Social studies, Science and Engineering and also Mathematics. Our team chose Science and Engineering, which involved portraying a world catastrophe which left our team stuck in a school, deaf. We then had to show ourselves making contact with others using a coded message, show what the coded message was and also creating the message.

The short term challenge is presented on the day, testing the team's time management skills and creativity. We really enjoyed working with people who weren't in our class or year, and it was a great opportunity to expand our problem solving and teamwork.
