Park safely and keep our kids safe

This year our school is participating in Auckland Transport's 'Safety at the School Gate' programme. Drivers who stop in the wrong place to drop off passengers put the safety of children at risk. Parking officers will be on patrol outside the school this year and will be issuing tickets to drivers who park illegally.

The agreed approach is 'zero tolerance' – There will be no warnings issued, you will receive a ticket if you are double parked, parked on yellow lines, or over someone's driveway – or for any other vehicle safety offence.

Please park legally to keep our children safe and to avoid being ticketed.

Park safely outside schools


Before and after school is a busy time for everyone. Parking rules help protect our children and keep them safe. Drivers who park illegally put our kids at risk. This means parking officers will be on patrol outside your school to issue tickets to those who are illegally parked.

Fines for illegal parking include:

- Parked on the footpath or grass verge/ berm **\$400**
- Parked across or within 1m of a vehicle entrance **\$400**
- Parked within 6m either side of an unmarked bus stop **\$400**
- Parked within a marked bus stop **\$400**
- Parked within 0.5m of a fire hydrant with no more than the car legally capable of moving it **\$400**
- Parked within a designated bus lane, transit, or cycle lane **\$400**
- Parked on a clearway **\$400**
- Double parked **\$400**
- Inconsiderate parking to other road users, including pedestrians **\$400**
- Parked on or within 5m of a school zone **\$400**
- Parked on a pedestrian crossing **\$400**
- Parked on a broken yellow line **\$400**

These parking offences are included in the New Zealand Road Rules.

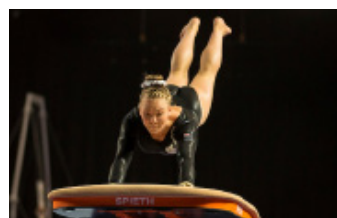
Volleyball

Congratulations to our Senior Boys and Girls volleyball teams who went to compete in the Auckland Championships last week from Thursday to Saturday. With close points for each set our boys did extremely well. Despite having to default one game, the boys were still high spirited that they were able to compete in their division.

Rosehill girls did well winning two out of five games. It was a close competition against the other schools however the girls were extremely satisfied that they won against Diocesan School who beat our girls in last year's competition.

Gymnastics

Caitlin Todd (Year 12) made a confident Senior International debut representing New Zealand at the gymnastics Individual Apparatus World Cup in Melbourne last month. Caitlin qualified through to the vault finals in fourth place behind the Chinese and Australian gymnasts. In the finals, she competed a new, more difficult, vault for the first time and improved her score from qualifications. She finished with the fifth highest score and only 0.3 off the bronze medal. This was Caitlin's first experience of competing in front of TV cameras, with the finals broadcast live on Fox



Sport (no pressure!). Caitlin is now back in the gym training for her next competition, the Australian National Championships in late May.



Waterpolo

It was her first time playing for 4 girls in our team.

In our third game we played St Marys College. This was a close encounter with our 3 experienced players Jessica Ingram, Chloe Rickit and Kate Logan, (whom had all played well throughout the tournament) controlling the game from the outset and all scoring goals. The other team members were getting a better understanding of the game at this level and began to do well on defence. We came away with a 7-3 win.



The new players, and those whom hadn't played for a while, improved with every game which is great and all are looking forward to the next game on 8 April.

Horse of the Year
