CYBERSAFETY USE AGREEMENT ROSEHILL COLLEGE STUDENTS 2017



Digital learning is key to learning at Rosehill College and all students are provided a school Google account for learning purposes.

This agreement covers students who access any digital device using the school computer network, or within the school grounds, whether it be on a school device or a student's personal device.

The agreement also covers Rosehill College students using digital devices on a cellular communication network, recognising that non-harmful communication is a requirement of conduct for all students, regardless of what equipment is used.

The Harmful Digital Communications Act 2015 also makes harmful digital communication a criminal offence under New Zealand law.

- 1. Students cannot use school the school network until they and parents have read, signed and returned the agreement form.

SECTION ONE (A) - STUDENTS

	I will not download or access any material that I am not legally entitled to.
	I will only use my phone in ways that follow the school guidelines as described in the Student Handbook
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ir i accidentally access offensive material, i will:
Not show others Turn off the screen or minimise the window and Report the incident to a teacher immediately.
I will protect the security of the school network by following these rules: I will not intentionally disrupt the smooth running of any school ICT systems. I will not connect any device (such as a USB drive, camera or phone) to, or attempt to run any software on, school ICT without staff permission including all wireless technologies. Not attempt to hack or gain unauthorised access to any school ICT system I will report any ICT breakages/damage to a staff member.
I accept that the school has rights to protect people and the network:
I will not use VPN or proxy services to bypass access to non-educational websites. I understand that the school monitors traffic and material sent and received using the school's ICT network.
I understand the school may use filtering and/or monitoring software to restrict access to certain sites and data.
I understand that the school may access my school Google account for security or assessment purposes.
I understand the school may use consequences for students breaking this agreement: I understand that if I break these rules, the school may inform my parent(s). I understand that in serious cases the school may take disciplinary action against me. I understand that my family may be charged for repair costs caused by my behaviour. If illegal materia or activities are involved, it may be necessary for the school to inform the police.
SECTION ONE (B) - STUDENTS Responsible Use of Student Devices
BYOD students are responsible for having their device ready for learning each day I will have my device fully charged at the start of each day. I understand it is my responsibility to see the network technicians to get a wireless connection. I understand that if my device becomes unusable for any reason, I am expected to work with pen and paper. I will protect my device from accidental damage by using care and by using protective cases.
SECTION ONE (C) - PARENTS Working Together with the School

Parents recognise their value in helping to build digitally safe teenagers

- Talk regularly with your teen about the need for respectful and responsible use of digital devices
- If you are worried about what your teen is doing with his/her device, consider a ban on private bedroom
- Develop at least a basic understanding of how your teen is using the device for learning.
- Encourage your teen to have balance in his/her life some teens find gaming or social media addictive and may need firm guidance to achieve balance.
