- OR phone our Attendance Officer on 295 0661 Ext 869
- OR provide a note explaining the student's absence

If a student needs to leave school during the day

- please provide a note for your student to take to their Head of House
- the student is to obtain an 'Exit Permit' from their Head of House **before Tutor time**

If a student is unwell during the course of the day – they should go to the nurse.

If a student is late to school before tutor time finishes – the student must go to their Tutor Teacher to sign in late

Students spend three days in teams solving a dynamic crime scenario with forensic tools and logic. They then swap to a courtroom for a dramatic two days as they prosecute their case in mock trials, cheered on by parents and friends. With input and lectures from the NZ Police, ESR forensic scientists and lawyers, this is the most fun you can legally have with guns, knives, blood and fingerprinting powder!

The 150 Detectives in the standard Forensics camp are typically in Year 7-10, however we will certainly consider motivated students from outside this age range.
