# From the Student Office



Rosehill student Alexa Kennedy has recently attended the Auckland Secondary schools trampoline championships. She not only attended but took out top marks winning gold in the elite category and even exceeded the best male score.

Alexa also attended the Australian nationals in Melbourne last week where she competed in the Junior International category (the only level above this is for open adults, over 18 yrs). She won gold in the individual event, bronze in the double mini trampoline event and another gold in the synchronised event with a partner from Christchurch! So overall Alexa has had a great campaign with the first of two very solid world qualifiers under her belt. She's looking to qualify again in the coming North Island champs to secure a place on the NZ team to travel to Denmark in November this year.
