Diwali

Deepawali or Diwali is the biggest and the brightest of all Hindu festivals. It is the festival of lights: deep means "light" and avari "a row," or "a row of lights." Diwali, the Indian festival of lights, falls on the day of 'Amavasya' when the moon does not rise and there is darkness all around. Light, being a symbol of hope and positive energy, indicates the victory of good over evil. By spreading light in every corner of our premises, we try to destroy the reign of darkness, on the night of Diwali. In various cultures in India there are different reasons to celebrate Diwali. For Hindus, Diwali is celebrated to honour Rama-chandra, the seventh avatar (incarnation of the god Vishnu). It is believed that on this day Rama returned to his people after 14 years of exile during which he fought and won a battle against the demons and the demon king, Ravana.



For Sikhs, Diwali is particularly important because it celebrates the release from prison of the sixth guru, Guru Hargobind, and 52 other princes with him, in 1619. The Sikh tradition holds that the Emperor Jahangir had imprisoned Guru Hargobind and 52 princes. The Bengalis worship Goddess Kali, the lamps are lit in temples and houses on Diwali in honour of Goddess Kali and her power to destroy all evils. Goddess Kali represents the destruction of evil, and is more dreaded than respected. Diwali has a very special significance in Jainism. It marks the anniversary of Nirvana (final release) or liberation of Mahavira's soul, the twenty fourth and last Jain Tirthankara of present cosmic age. It is celebrated at the same time as the Hindu festival of Diwali.



At Rosehill we celebrated Diwali on 18th October, where staff joined in this celebration by dressing up in more colourful outfits and some staff even wore traditional Indian dresses like Shervani, turban, Sarees and Punjabi Salwaar Kameez. At Lunch time staff with Indian background organised lunch and sweets for everyone.

Top-up your NCEA credits Study online with Te Kura Summer School

If you want to go onto further study, training, or employment in 2018 and think you may not have enough NCEA credits, we have an option for you to get back on track.

From 4 December, Te Kura (The Correspondence School) is accepting short term enrolments from students who want to use the summer break to earn additional credits or specific internal standards in NCEA. Credits for school work submitted for assessment by February 14 can be counted towards your 2017 Record of Achievement.

Courses are delivered online so, with access to a computer and the internet, you can learn anywhere and anytime. Te Kura's qualified teachers will be available online to answer any questions and assess students' work.

Key Dates

- 4 December: Enrolments open
- 18 December: Summer School starts
- 2 February: Enrolments close
- 14 February: Students must have final work submitted for assessment for the credits achieved to be counted towards 2017 Record of Achievement
- 23 February: Summer School closes

As a general guide, to enrol with Te Kura at no cost you must be:

- aged 16-19 years

(Students turning 20 years or older in 2018 will be charged an administration fee of \$111 per subject)




