The NCEA Review was released on Tuesday and the overview can be read at [NCEA Change Package Overview 2019](#). As noted, the NCEA fee of \$76.70 has been removed and our accounts department is working to refund any NCEA fees paid for 2019, or if preferred, the amount can be reassigned to pay for other fees owing, such as tournament week fees. This will take a little time for our accounts staff to process, so please be patient.

Other changes to NCEA will be trialled at Level 1 in 2021, with 2022 being a transition year and 2023 full implementation. NCEA Level 2 will be fully implemented in 2024 and Level 3 in 2025.

The combined primary and secondary schools' teacher unions, NZEI and PPTA, have notified a nationwide strike on Wednesday May 29. Rosehill College will be open for instruction, although normal lessons will not take place. Students will be supervised in study for the day. Students attending school will meet in the Hall at 8.40am to be allocated to study groups. Their attendance will be marked each period, and normal school procedures and rules apply for the day. The canteen will not be open, and so students attending school that day must bring their own food for break times. The morning bus runs will take place, but if no students are brought to school on a particular bus, then that bus will not run in the afternoon.

Today was Pink Shirt Day, a time to stand up against bullying. Many Year 13 students and staff dressed in pink clothing, while other year levels wore pink accessories. Funds raised will go to the Mental Health Foundation NZ.


For those candidates standing at this election, a meeting to enable parents to meet and hear from candidates will be held at the school on Thursday 30 May, 7pm.

LOVES ME NOT PROGRAMME

This year we are extremely fortunate again that our school is able to deliver the 'Loves Me Not' Program to all of our Year 12 students on Thursday 30th May. It will be a whole day workshop facilitated by Police and teaching staff. The programme is inspired by real events. The Police Educators present evidence to engage young people in conversations regarding safety in relationships and how to read signs of unsafe relationships. The messages that are delivered by the programme are extremely important for students to enable them to identify healthy and unhealthy relationships so they can make safe choices in regards to their relationships now and in the future. All Year 12 students are expected to be at school and to participate in this beneficial program. Loves-Me-Not aims to:

- assist schools that are seeking to support student well-being through a whole-school approach
- encourage and empower young people to absolutely reject abuse in relationships
- encourage young people to be safe and active bystanders who take action against unhealthy relationships
- encourage young people to take a stand against myths in society that perpetuate relationship violence
- help young people know who they can go to in their community to seek advice and support if they need it as either victims or perpetrators
- encourage young people to contribute to, or create a wider community response so as to encourage others to accept only healthy relationships.

REACH SCHOLARSHIP

Applications Open: 10 May
Applications Close: 15 June

R.E.A.C.H (REACH): Realising Educational Aspirations for Careers in Health, is a scholarship for Year 13 Māori secondary students interested in a career in health.

The REACH Scholarship provides a fully funded opportunity for Year 13 Māori students to spend three nights and two full days on the Otago University campus exploring health science degree options. Flights, transfers, food and accommodation in a University of Otago Residential College are included.

REACH will help you gain an understanding of 'life' on campus and learn about health science study and degree/career options at the University of Otago. You will participate in hands-on learning including lectures, labs and 'tutes', visit several of the University of Otago's Residential Colleges and meet key Māori contacts on campus.

Eligibility: Applications are sought from full time Year 13 students of Māori descent, who are currently enrolled in a New Zealand Secondary School and are considering studying at the University of Otago the following year. All applicants should be students who are completing their final year of secondary schooling and are likely to gain University Entrance (UE).
