CHOOSING SUBJECTS FOR 2020.

Current year 9, 10, 11 and 12 students have to choose their 2020 subjects by 21 August.

Next Tuesday each receives a Subject Selection Form. This needs to be discussed with parents/caregivers and signed by one before 21 August. The student also has to enter their subjects through the student Portal.

Installation of Google Management Licenses

Rosehill College will be requiring students with Chromebooks in Years 9 to 12 to have Google Management Licenses installed on their Chromebooks. Students were informed at the end of last Term and more detailed information will be available on the school website from next week.

What is happening:

In order to better facilitate on-task work in classrooms and encourage habits of being responsible online users, Rosehill College will install management software on Year 9 to 12 student Chromebooks that will ensure students can connect to the school network only and therefore control what is available for students on the internet and ensure that their managed accounts have no access to games or social media accounts. This managed account will run for the duration of the school day and then be disabled when the student returns home. Parents will be able to choose to have the student's device managed full time as well at a later date.

Why is it happening?

Research tells us that being in an online space and having an online persona are increasingly difficult for students to manage. Expectations for online behaviour require mature decision making and even in a normal school social environment students make mistakes. Making a mistake online can have significant and long term consequences. 44% of all incident reports that end up being reviewed by the Principal for disciplinary action in 2019 had direct connection to the misuse of a device, up from 22% in 2018. The Pastoral team of H.O.H's and Counselors are increasingly spending more of their time unraveling issues that occur online and then have real world ramifications. By providing a secure network and a number of programs that teach students how to navigate an online environment Rosehill College will allow students the time and space to become adept at using the internet responsibly.

When is this happening?

The installation of the software will happen on Wednesday the 7th, Thursday the 8th and Friday the 9th of August. Different Year groups will be required to drop off their Chromebooks to get the software installed and then be required to collect them a couple of hours later. Students will be given labels for their Chromebooks and will need to have their student I.D to collect their device when the process is complete. The specific times and groups will be communicated via Tutor Groups and the school website. Students will need to ensure that their Chromebook is fully charged.

Mr Spackman the Deputy Principal in charge of I.C.T will be available to answer questions at the Careers and Option Evening on Monday the 5th of August in the Hall from 6pm to 8pm.

Qiaoshang Cup

Year 10 students Campbell Morling and Ronan Cribb have been in China on a trip of a lifetime as part of the Manurewa AFC and SAE U15 Academy team that was invited to the first "Qiaoshang Cup" International Youth Football Tournament held in Duyan City in the Guizhou province.

The 12 teams invited to the tournament, included teams from professional clubs from Russia, Korea, Thailand and France as well as mainland china. Along with the high level football the trip serves as a cultural exchange for the players and to experience life as a professional footballer for a week. Campbell was given the honour to captain the team for the tour. As part of the opening ceremony the team were asked to perform a haka on stage as part of opening celebrations.

With temperatures in the mid 30s playing 80 minute football games was always going to be a hard task for the NZ team. They drew 0-0 in their first pool game, just lost 1 nil in the second to Changmai FC from Thailand, the 3rd game was hotly contested on the hottest day in china this year with the team losing 2-1. Based on points the team finished outside the top eight so did not continue into the knock out stage. They will play the Korean team in a friendly match and take in the sights of the Guizhou province until they return Sunday night.
