Equestrian Achievement

Alyssa Harrison (12RMU) recently featured on the cover of Rural Living magazine as well as featuring in the Show Circuit magazine. Both magazines highlight her achievements in dressage and eventing. Alyssa has two horses, Da Vinci Code (Davey) and Jack Be Nimble R (Jack). Davey is her main horse who she competes in eventing and dressage as well as doing a lot of free riding with him. She mainly competes Jack in dressage.



In April this year Alyssa and three other students from across New Zealand competed in the 2019 Tintern Grammar 19th Annual Victorian Inter-school Horse Trials Championship held in Melbourne. The team came second after competing against schools from across Australia and Hong Kong, a massive achievement as the team were on borrowed horses! Wearing the Silver Fern was a big honour for Alyssa. She also won the Overall DC Secondary School Rider title at the NZPCA Eventing Championship this year.

Being a member of the NZ Pony Club Association (currently a part of the Waiau Pa club) since she was 6, has been beneficial to both her riding and horsemanship. The ultimate goal for Alyssa is to travel to England to work in the horse industry and, hopefully, accompany some of our Kiwi riders to competitions before returning to New Zealand to attend University to study to be a Veterinary Physiotherapist, as well as compete to the top level herself.
