On Monday 8 June at dawn we held the whakatuweratanga (blessing) of this new facility for our three DHB Nurses and the Doctor who is here one day a week. This will provide illness prevention services as well as consultation and assistance for those students who are unwell at school.

- The focus and concentration in classes is at a very good level in the College, owing to the concern students have for their achievement this year and in response teachers are delivering as much recovery and catch up work as possible.

School Canteen


The canteen have updated and expanded their menu to include filled rolls, wraps and other fresh products.


