There's a New Kid in Town: Bachelor of Nursing

Introducing our newest qualification, the [Bachelor of Nursing](#). With mental health needs rising sharply and services already stretched, the University of Waikato is responding to the challenge with the launch of their new Bachelor of Nursing in 2021, integrating a focus on mental health and addictions throughout the three-year degree.

This programme will be offered from the Hamilton Campus in 2021 with a limited number of places, so students interested are encouraged to make contact as soon as possible to ensure they can be considered for entry. To gain admission, the student needs to have achieved University Entrance (no subjects in particular), and go through the formal application process which includes an interview.

This long-awaited degree will provide students with more clinical hours than most other providers and put them in excellent stead to meet the emerging health needs of New Zealanders.

Upcoming Drop In Sessions

As mentioned, we have a number of events on campus that prospective students are welcome to attend. In addition to those detailed above, students might find it useful to attend our drop in sessions being held at the Hamilton and Tauranga Campus'. These provide an opportunity to tour the campus, meet with an Adviser to discuss study options, and confirm enrolment/paper selection.

Unistart Programmes for 2021

Take University papers while at secondary school and get a head start in your degree with Waikato's Unistart programme. There are options to take papers online or at our Hamilton and Tauranga campuses.

The University of Waikato Unistart Scholarship covers the cost of up to two Unistart papers. Students will automatically be considered for this when accepted into Unistart - no additional application is required. To gain the scholarship, students will need to have a NCEA Level 2 Merit Endorsement overall, as well as be a New Zealand Citizen or Permanent Resident.

Congratulations

Paris Boyce-Bacon was selected to represent Auckland at the New Zealand Gymnastics New Zealand Super Series Aerobics competition. Paris came away not only as the 'North Island champion' but ranked 1st in New Zealand out of all North Island and South Island competitors. She is now ranked 1st in NZ overall. Congratulations on all your hard work.

Over the weekend Chloe Clarke, Zoe Shuker and Meg Shuker competed at the New Zealand Secondary School Swimming Championships in Hamilton.

It was great for our swimmers to be able to compete in this championship event which was originally scheduled in August but was postponed due to the recent re-emergence of Covid.

This is a national event with tight qualifying times so to even be competing in the event is an achievement in itself.

The girls all performed well over the weekend, with each of them recording at least one Personal Best time.

Zoe achieved three top ten placings in the 17/18 year old age group, finishing 6th in the 200m breaststroke, and 10th in both 100m and 50m breaststroke. Chloe also performed well in what was her first national event, with a 10th placing in the 100m breaststroke in the 13 year old age group her best result, while Meg swam well in what was a very competitive age-group - her best result was 21st in the 200m freestyle in the 15 year old girls.

Zoe also qualified and competed in the 100m and 200m breaststroke at the New Zealand Short Course Championships over the October school holidays.

Well done to all the girls on their achievements in the pool.




