The projects ranged from building a pump and water filter, building a trebuchet, Ping-Pong cannon, scissor lift, and other projects with several of our teams gaining first places. This day is organised by the Pūhoro STEM academy that aims to promote STEM related careers for Māori students. They are currently mentoring students at Years 11, 12 and 13 and will continue mentoring some of our students next year at tertiary institutions.



