

## 2021 Creatives in schools

Rosehill College has been announced as a recipient of a 2021 Creatives in schools grant from Creative New Zealand. This \$10,000 grant funds an artist from the community to come into Rosehill College and lend their expertise to a specific programme, proposed by the school. The grant will be used in the college's Dance programme, in partnership with the artist Alex Page. Alex is currently working as a professional dancer, teacher, choreographer and freelance videographer specialising in Hip Hop and Street dance. She was part of the HHI crew scene for 5 years and won multiple national and international medals. Working as a back up dancer in Shanghai and on kids TV shows 'Kpop academy' and 'The Exceptional Squad' have been some notable highlights. As a choreographer Alex has showcased recent works in national digital festivals and as a member of OTB - a collective lead by Lydia



Rasmussen, Alex has been able to develop and perform pieces as part of dance festivals 'Short + Sweet' and 'Tempo'. As a current dancer of Rina Chae's 'Street Candee Dance Company' and the competing house of 'The House of Candee' Alex learns from numerous international Street dance pioneers. This opportunity for Alex to work closely with the Rosehill dance students is very exciting, a massive thank you to Ms Rasmussen making it all possible.
