

Bookings are now OPEN.

We invite you to meet with your child's subject teachers on Monday 10 May (Parent Surnames M-Z) from 2.30pm to 6.00pm. Please note that classes will finish at 1.40pm. It is expected that students are present at the interviews, if possible. Murphy's buses will operate at 1.40pm and the AT Metro buses at the usual time of 3.20pm. Students are welcome to remain at school to study.

To make appointments you will need:

Your child's subjects and the names of their subject teachers.

- 1) On the internet go to: www.schoolinterviews.co.nz
- 2) Click 'Make a Booking' and enter School Event Code: **edbpy** then hit "Go".
- 3) Enter your email address (if you have one) and your full name. If more than 1 child, enter 'Book for [Number of students]'. Enter your child/ren's full name/s (and a student ID number if known). Hit "Go".
- 4) For each child select one of their subjects from the drop-box, then teacher from the drop-box below. Click 'Add another Teacher' and repeat for all their subjects.
- 5) When finished, hit "Go".
- 6) Select the date and times you would like to have the interviews. Thursday's interviews appear first; scroll down for Monday's interviews. Please remember to leave 5 minutes (1 block) between appointments so that you can get from one teacher to the next.
- 7) Once you have confirmed the times by hitting the "Go" button, a confirmation email will go to your email address. If you do not have an email, you can either write the information down, print off the times or call the school and we can do so for you. **Please bring the confirmation with you on the day.** Click FINISHED to complete your bookings.
- 8) If you require assistance to make bookings, please call the school on (09) 295 0661

Appointment times are 5 minutes each. If you need longer to discuss your child's progress in a particular subject, please arrange a separate time to meet with the teacher concerned.

If you are unable to attend on the date of the first letter of your surname due to other commitments, please feel free to book on the alternate date.

If you are unable to attend on either date but wish to make contact with your child's teachers, please contact the school (outside of school holidays) to arrange this.


Rugby drills and training sessions culminated in some outstanding rugby skills being on display during the weekend.


