## Senior students coming into school.

## Vaccination Register for all Students

All registered schools who enrol students over the age of 12 years are required to maintain an up-to-date register with the COVID-19 vaccination status of these (eligible) students. The preferred evidence is as follows:

- a screenshot of their vaccination record on My Covid Record (for those 16 and over)
- a vaccination certificate (which can be requested from the Ministry of Health)
- a letter from their GP.

Please note that the vaccination card is not considered suitable evidence by the Ministry of Health. If this is all you can provide for now, then send it through and we will be in touch again if necessary.

## Update on University of Auckland entry requirements and support

The University of Auckland recognises that 2021 has been another challenging year for students with many disruptions due to Covid-19. We are aware of the serious impacts of the continued Covid-19 disruptions on achievement for some of your senior students. For some students who started the year with the ambition of achieving UE and starting University study in 2022, these impacts may have been particularly severe.

Adjustments to University Entrance have been made for NCEA, Cambridge International and International Baccalaureate to recognise the impact of continued lockdowns. Universities will accept the results as given from the NZQA, Cambridge International and IB. Results received from the NZQA will not distinguish how the result has been achieved (ie. Derived or Unexpected Event Grades or one resulting from an examination will not be differentiated). Similarly, the results will not show which students have achieved UE through these mechanisms and those who have not.

### Changes to Early Programme (Fast Track Offers) for 2022

All students with a Fast Track offer for entrance in 2022 will be guaranteed an offer of place if they achieve University Entrance. The Guaranteed Entry Score will not be required for entrance for those who have received a Fast Track offer however specific subject requirements for entrance into the Bachelor of Engineering (Hons), Bachelor of Global Studies, Bachelor of Health Sciences, and the Bachelor of Nursing will be required. Alternative programme options will be considered where required and as in previous years consideration will be given to those who are under the guaranteed entry requirements. [Undergraduate Targeted Admission Scheme \(UTAS\)](#) will continue to be in place with the continued wrap around support throughout their study.

### Discretionary Entrance

The University wants to work with you to support university pathways of success for students. If Year 13 students who you feel they have the potential to be successful at University but have been so impacted by Covid-19 that their likely UE success (even with the modified UE requirement) has been severely compromised, they should apply to Mrs McConchie for a Principal recommendation to be sent through to the admissions team at [supportteam@auckland.ac.nz](mailto:supportteam@auckland.ac.nz) for consideration under Discretionary Entry. Final decisions on these applications will be made after results have been released in January.

### Support and Study over Summer

The University of Auckland has in place several opportunities for students to take part in a one course University experience over the summer. [Summer Start](#) offers the opportunity for students to experience our campus, make friends and prepare for Semester One by studying one course. [UniBound Summer – Pacific](#) is to support our Pacific school leavers who would like to prepare for Semester One by completing one course (PACIFIC 110). [Tōia ki Waipapa](#) offers the Summer experience to Māori school leavers who will complete MĀORI 130 as their summer course. All summer courses offer excellent transition for students from school into study at the University of Auckland, allowing them to build their knowledge and experience of University prior to Semester One.

For any students who may feel unprepared to move directly into a degree programme or who may have missed gaining University Entrance requirements, the [Tertiary Foundation Certificate](#) is a one year full time programme to prepare students for study in a degree programme. A recent change in the TFC structure, introducing the addition of TFC pathways, provides specific pathways to prepare students for their degree programmes. If students are not sure which area they would like to study in, they can also choose a General pathway, allowing students to select courses that will prepare them to enter most degree programmes at the University of Auckland.

### Vaccination Policy

The University has confirmed that from 4 January 2022 all students, staff and visitors will need to be fully vaccinated as a condition of being able to take part in face-to-face University-managed activities or to enter our campuses. This includes teaching and learning spaces (such as workshops, classes, labs, tutorials, meetings, noho marae, exams, and assessments), libraries, student services, student accommodation, gyms, counselling and health services, offices and research and related activity settings.
